Science Week

We have had such a fantastic week this week with Science Week. All the children have been involved in investigations and experiments. Year 4 learnt about the digestive system (phew!). Young Explorers investigated which materials were waterproof so they could keep their teddies dry. Year 1 designed their own plants; they had to ensure they would attract bees, be rooted into the soil and collect sunshine. Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed the fact that science can be fun, messy AND full of learning. They made slime, investigated the effect of washing up liquid on coloured milk, made a variety of micro-organisms in petri dishes – and saw how the addition of sugar encouraged the yeast solutions to race to the top of the cylinder. Great fun was had by all – with a lot of cleaning up to be done On Monday, Year 6 donned their lab coats and set up their Science Fair in the hall. Year 2 and 3 were invited to visit the experiment stations, to learn about everything from exploding volcanoes to homemade slime! The year 6 pupils prepared everything at home and are to be commended on the efforts they made to impart snippets of scientific knowledge.
