Create a "Moon Diary". Every night look at the moon and draw and describe what you see. Present it to me in an interesting way.



- *Observing & Recording*
- *Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth*

Learn a poem about the moon and the stars and perform it to the class



- *Prepare poems and plays to read aloud and to perform, showing understanding through intonation, tone and volume so that the meaning is clear to an audience.*

Make a model of a Viking long ship. You can make it out of whatever material you like – and if you wish you can make it with a friend!



- *Develop a range of practical skills to create products (such as cutting, drilling and screwing, nailing, gluing, filling and sanding, painting and constructing).*

Research Viking Gods and make a poster about your favourite.



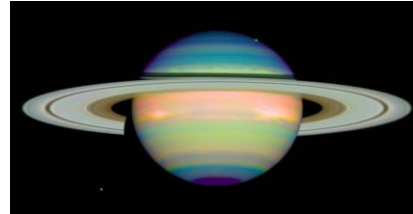
- *Describe the social, ethnic, cultural or religious diversity of past society.*
- *Describe the characteristic features of the past, including ideas, beliefs, attitudes and experiences of men, women and children.*

If you like maths – can you make a poster about the size of planets and how far away they are from Earth?



- Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system.
- Read & Write numbers up to 10 000 000
- Present work neatly, clearly and appropriately for your audience

Research information about the planets. Can you make a model of our solar system – or just one of the planets?



Cut materials with precision and refine the finish with appropriate tools (such as sanding wood after cutting or a more precise scissor cut after roughly cutting out a shape).

- Show an understanding of the qualities of materials to choose appropriate tools to cut and shape (such as the nature of fabric may require sharper scissors than would be used to cut paper).

Use original ways to present information and ideas.

It has been 50 years since the moon landing. Can you write a report about it? What fact and information can you find out?



- Write non-chronological reports –include headings, sub-titles, pictures, third person, technical vocabulary, past tense.

Create a Powerpoint with an interactive timeline of important Viking events.



- Place events, artefacts and historical figures on a time line using dates.
