
Well-being

Do you know when schools will reopen?

Unfortunately we don't get any information in advance, and often, quite frustratingly, we hear on the daily briefings at the same time as you. Having said that we are of course in discussions internally with governors and staff as to what/how/when. We do know that there has to very careful consideration as how to keep children and staff safe in any kind of reopening. To manage expectations it is important to note that schools will not open back to normal like 'the flick of a switch'. As I am sure you appreciate there are so many variables to consider; is the country still in some kind of lockdown; how many staff are available; how many children; which children; how do you implement social distancing with young children....and the list goes on.


