Whilst the staff and Governors have already begun to consider the logistics of this, I would like to reassure you that the safety of children and staff will be paramount as we move forwards.

Reopening was conditional on a number of aspects of our current situation and the Government will review these before confirming the reopening over the next few weeks.

Right now, our situation has not changed. We will continue to provide you with learning packs and support you in Home Learning with your children and we will continue to open for children of key workers.

recommend aspects of it for you to use with your children.

Maths: You will find shortly that White Rose Maths will refer you to Bitesize for further learning each day so keep accessing White Rose from our planning as you normally do.

English: The short interactive lessons and activities are really useful for keeping up with key skills. We have added in a reminder on our planning page to make this one of your child's choices for the day. They should still prioritise their spelling - especially Spelling Frame for KS2

Topic: Bitesize is producing lessons everyday on a many topics including science, history, geography, music and art. We recommend letting your child choose anything from within their Key Stage that interests them. It has a great variety of lessons which are bound to capture the imagination and provide really good learning opportunities.
