Year 3 and Year 4 were outside together having a very energetic athletics session so I had a little snoop around the classrooms. In Year 3 I learnt that sloths can sleep for up to 2 days and make the best "Lazy Pets". Year 4 have a wonderful display of stone paintings – designed and painted in Forest School with an Aboriginal twist!

Year 5 are leading the way in the Juniors by working very hard on developing good friendships and learning how to solve conflict successfully. A very important life skill I'm sure you will agree. Finally in Year 6 a very quiet and studious approach to the work of Lichtenstein – analysing the styles and techniques he used. I have a feeling this is leading to an exciting self-portrait.
