

Dear Parents,

Well we are heading towards half term and I hope you are all still well and safe. The school will continue to be open for key workers to access the childcare provision during the holiday period although we have said that we will not be sending out Home Learning during this time. I hope that you are able to take time off with your children and enjoy the sun!

I would like to thank staff again – I realise that the teaching profession gets teased about the amount of holiday that we have but May half term will be the second holiday that they will have worked through. This holiday time cannot be reclaimed as in other professions later in the year. So thank you Loxwood staff.

Potential re-opening of schools 1st June

There is a lot of anxiety, worry and questions regarding the re-opening of schools. The Government has reiterated that this re-opening is conditional, so we will not have any confirmation until an update towards the end of the month.

Having said that we have been working tirelessly on our school risk assessment. This is complex and we are following Government guidance as we go.

Governors are going to ratify this risk assessment towards the end of this week and then we will prepare to send it out to parents with a plan of re-opening.

From our survey the most frequent questions seem to be:

Can I decide if my child goes back to school?

As a parent you are fully in control of assessing the information given and deciding whether you wish your child to return to school (if your child's year group is open)

Can I choose part time?

If you are a key worker you will book your child in for the days that you are working.

If your child's class is open to return we will be requesting that they come in on every day offered to them. This can not be enforced but would greatly assist us in planning staffing and curriculum.

If my child isn't in a year group that is open when will they return?

Unfortunately we don't know this - I am not sure if anyone can see that far into the future at the moment. But we, like you await Government updates, and hope to see all the children before the summer. If it is safe to do so.

Hopefully many of your other questions will be answered within the risk assessment.

Home Learning

To give the children a break from home learning there will be no learning pack for half term. You will see new learning appear towards the end of half term week ready for 1st June. Thank you again for all of your hard work in supporting your children with their tasks. The teachers will be working throughout half term in preparation for the Government's request for us to begin gradually opening up to more children. 
Do you need short term help or support with food or finances?




Daisy busy with her maths










