### We're all Ears Survey

Chartwells' mission is to nourish young bodies and minds, and in order to do so, we want to make sure that our food offer meets the ever changing needs of our students. To gather the insight we need, our two **We're All Ears surveys** (*one for parents and one for our children*) are being launched on **Monday 18th November** and will stay open until **Saturday 30th November** and we need your support! **What is the survey?** The survey consists of a list of questions to better understand the decision making process of our consumer as well as their food preferences in more detail than we have ever explored before.

We will be collecting the monetary donation on Friday morning, this will help go towards covering some of the expenses incurred in holding the event! There is also a green collection box in reception if you are not around on Friday morning and want to drop it in at a more convenient time! There will be no cake raffle on Friday.

Santa's Grotto tickets are available via Classlist (we do urge you to download the app) with payment taken via PayPal. Tickets are £2.50 now and will be £3.00 on the night (spaces are limited so we do suggest you book soon!)

The fair cannot happen if we don't get enough helpers! There has been a spreadsheet that is continually updated (contact your class representative or myself to put your name down over the weekend or if you don't do drop off/pick up. There will be a sign up sheet up outside in the mornings or in reception after school please do add your name - all we ask is for 30 minutes of your time (it is also good fun!). We are trying to encourage the Year 6 and 5 children to help, so there are spaces for them to add their name as well!

To give you an idea of what to expect on the night...

We will be using tokens for the games - 1 token = 50p. Most games are 1 or 2 tokens. And will be available to purchase in the Hall (please return the reusable bags the tokens come in.

The Chocolate and Toy Tombola will be 3 tickets for 50p good luck!

Also in the Hall will be crafts that the children have made at school. Barrel of booze - tickets will be £1, Guess the Weight of the Cake (made and donated by Van der Schnoodle Cakes) are £1, Name the Toy and Guess how many Sweeties in the jar will be 50p a guess!

We have a fantastic raffle with the main prize £100 cash! (very useful just before Christmas!)

In Year 4 classroom we will have some 2nd hand uniform available for donations, a book sale and some more details of the Loxwood School Wish List - do pop in for a rummage!
