Dear Parents,



We have had a busy couple of weeks with some of the children going out to represent the school in various sporting and singing events. We are very proud of how they have behaved and have represented the school.

We are busy fitting in rehearsals for our production of 'Alice in Wonderland' which the children will perform to you next week. The children have worked so hard and it is going to be a fantastic show! Make sure you have got your tickets for it!!

In Maths this week, we have been looking at shape and different types of lines and angles found in 2d and 3d shapes. This is all to help build up the children's knowledge of more complex shapes and the properties within them.

In English this week, the class have shown Miss Cullom their debating skills. They have had to argue for or against the use of single use plastic, and have taken on either side of the argument. The class have also worked on giving constructive feedback to each other to help them improve their debating skills.

In Science we looked at reproduction in plants through pollination. The class asked really sensible questions showing maturity in their enquiry.

Over the previous two weeks we have played a variety of sports including cricket, rounders and a golf session. With Mr Green we have begun some sessions on sports leadership with Year 6 sports

leadership in mind. We are also playing rounders on a Friday with Year 6.

We continue our Mockumentaries in computing, the children are finalising their scripts and we will begin to film in the next couple of weeks.

A new homework grid is up on our class page, so are the spellings for the half term. Most of the class work on the group 1 spellings with a few children working on group 2 (the children know which group they are in). We expect the children to be learning their spellings every week and to bring their spelling book into school every <u>Thursday</u>. This is so that we can see the learning that they have been doing over the week and set the next set of spellings. In addition to learning their spellings, we also expect the children to write down a sentence using each of the spellings.
