We are really pleased that 100% of parents and children that responded felt their child was happy and safe at the school. Various suggestions we have taken on already are: setting up an auto response on our messages@ and absence@ email accounts so you can see that your message has been received; better parental engagement and involvement and developing a new website. We are looking at further ideas especially in relation to providing feedback on how your child is getting on and communication.

New Governors:

We have been lucky to have three parents come forward as Governors. So, we welcome Bryn Brooker and Laura Walker as Parent Governors and Phil Wannell as a Co-Opted Governor. They bring a great range of skills to this role and we are so excited to have them supporting the strategic leadership of our school.

Clerk to the Governing Body Vacancy:

We are advertising for a new Clerk to the Governing Body. The role involves preparing agendas and associated papers and taking minutes at all Governor Meetings. These mainly take place in the evenings (5.30pm), but there may be the odd one during the day. The workload is variable and hours to be worked are flexible, depending on when meetings are arranged. Currently, we are holding around one meeting per month, which lasts about two hours (except August) and hours worked for one meeting and all the associated paperwork would be around 6 hours. The post also involves record keeping, managing the Governors section on the website, working with the Chair in managing the smooth and efficient running of the Governing Body, learning about governance and being able to answer questions for the governing body on governance. Full training will be given. Access to the internet and the ability to work at home and in school is essential.
