Create a fact file about a Maya warrior (with at least 8 key facts).



- Describe the characteristic features of the past, including ideas, beliefs, attitudes and experiences of men, women and children.

Find a poem about chocolate. Learn it off by heart and present to the class.



- Prepare poems and plays to read aloud and to perform, showing understanding through intonation, tone and volume so that the meaning is clear to an audience.

Design and make a model of a Maya pyramid. Explain its purpose and why people used it.



- Develop a range of practical skills to create products (such as cutting, drilling and screwing, nailing, gluing, filling and sanding, painting and constructing).

Find the most significant Maya dates and order them by date on a timeline.



- Describe the social, ethnic, cultural or religious diversity of past society.

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Present the Maya number system.
Show some calculations in 'Mayan'.
